#### Call for abstracts

The hybrid seminar 'Parliaments in the Age of Crises: From Innovative Research to Societal Practices' (ParlReSo) aims to explore the practical applications and societal impact of innovative interdisciplinary research on parliaments, including but not limited to the fields of digital humanities, political science, history, communication studies, discourse analysis and corpus linguistics. Of special interest is the transfer of knowledge between academic and non-academic communities, which offers mutual benefits for researchers, politicians, government officials and civil society.

The seminar invites contributions presenting findings from completed or ongoing research on parliamentary data, covering a wide range of topics in the humanities and social sciences. It is important, however, to clearly articulate how your research applies to decision-makers and / or society at large. The applications may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- · data-driven insights into past policy debates during times of crises to inform current decision-making;
- · insights into the use of language and framing in parliament, which can refine communication strategies for policy proposals, national addresses and other public messaging during times of crises;
- · introduction of digital tools (e.g., sentiment analysis, topic modelling) to enhance the transparency of parliamentary processes and improve the accountability of political actors;
- encouragement of active civic participation by raising political literacy and fostering more informed choices in parliamentary elections.
